**Whereas**, Maharashtra Public Universities Act 2016(VI of 2017)(hereinafter the Act) has come into force from 1<sup>st</sup> March, 2017;

Whereas, the University has issued Direction to 15 of 2017 dealing with composition of the four faculties created by the Act, where under the existing different faculties of the University have been merged into the four new faculties created by the Act, by which the subject of Rural Services has been included in the faculty of Humanities

Whereas, the University Grants Commission, New Delhi vide letter No.D.O.No.F-1-2/2008 (XI Plan) dated 31<sup>st</sup> January 2008 regarding new initiatives under the XIth Plan-Academic Reforms in the University has suggested for improving quality of higher education and to initiate the Academic Reforms at the earliest,

Whereas, the Special Task Committee in all the Social Sciences under the subjects of Rural Services in their meeting held during 02<sup>nd</sup> March 2016 to 16<sup>th</sup> May,2016 prepared the syllabi and scheme of examination for the Bachelor of Arts (Rural Services) Graduate Degree course Semester Pattern in the Faculty of Social Science and recommended to the Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor for starting from the academic session 2016-17.

Whereas The Hon'ble Vice Chancellor of Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University, Nagpur in exercise of powers vested under 14/7 of the Maharashtra University Act 1994 on behalf of the Board of Studies under the Faculty of Social Science and Faculty of Social Science has considered, accepted and recommended to Academic Council, the policy decision regarding introduction of Bachelor of Arts (Rural Services) Semester Pattern syllabi with draft direction and Scheme of examination of Semester-I to VI

Whereas, the Board of Studies of Rural Services in their meeting held on 31st October,2018 minor changes in the A.T.K.T. rules of the Direction No 13 of 2016 for Bachelor of Arts (Rural Services) Graduate Degree course Semester Pattern in the Faculty of Humanities (old Social Science) and recommended to the Faculty of Humanities for implementations from the academic session 2018-19 onwards.

**Whereas**, the new draft direction and scheme of examination as per Semester Pattern is to be implemented from the Academic Session 2018-19 for B.A. (Rural Services) semester- I and onwards which is to be regulated by this direction and as such there is no existence and framing of an Ordinance for the above examination is a time consuming process.

**Whereas**, the admission of students in the Semester Pattern at B.A. (R.S.) to be made in the Academic Session 2018-19.

# AND

**Whereas**, there is an exigency to issue new Direction replacing Direction No.13 of 2016 to address the problems faced by the students of the said course;

# AND

- Whereas, ordinance making is a time consuming process, therefore, I, Dr. Sidharthvinayaka Kane, Vice-Chancellor Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University, Nagpur in exercise of powers vested under Section 12(8) of the Maharashtra Public University Act 2016 do hereby issue the following Direction.
  - 1. This Direction may be called "Direction relating to examinations leading to the Bachelor Degree of Arts(Rural Service s), Semester Pattern. (Three Year Degree Course).
  - 2. The direction shall come into force from the date of its issuance and will be applicable to all the students taking admission in the Semester- 1<sup>st</sup> Semester and onwards Semesters during the academic session 2018-19 and onwards, till the relevant ordinance comes into being in accordance with the provisions of the Act.
  - 3. The duration of the B.A. (R.S.) course shall be of three academic years consisting of six semesters with the University examinations at the end of each semester namely:
    - a) B.A. (R.S.) Semester I Exam
    - b) B.A. (R.S.) Semester II Exam
    - c) B.A. (R.S.) Semester III Exam d)
    - B.A. (R.S.) Semester IVExam
    - e) B.A. (R.S.) Semester V Exam
    - f) B.A. (R.S.) Semester VI Exam
  - 4. The theory examination of Semester-I, II, III, IV, V and VI shall be conducted by the University and shall be held separately at the end of each semester at such places and dates

as may be decided and notified by the University and shall be held as per the schedule given in the Table below.

#### **ELIGIBILITY TO THE COURSE:**

- 5. Subject to compliance with the provisions of this Direction and of other ordinances in force from time to time, the following persons shall be eligible for admission to the examination:-
- (a) A student who has prosecuted a regular course of study for not less than six month prior to that examination;
- (b) A teacher in an Educational Institution eligible under the provisions of Ordinance No.18

  Provided that in the case of the persons eligible under clauses (b) and External applicant to the examination shall have attended a course of laboratory instructions by obtaining casual admission in a College in the subject in which laboratory work is prescribed. The candidate shall submit a certificate to that effect signed by the Principal of the college.
- (c) For external candidate the internal marks shall be assigned in proportionate to the marks scored by the candidate in theory examination conducted by the University.
- 6. Eligibility of every applicant for admission to B.A, Semester

Course shall be:- A) In case of the B.A. Semester I Examination:-

The candidate should have passed the 12<sup>th</sup> standard examination of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education in the Faculty of Arts or Faculty of Commerce or Faculty of Science, Vocational Stream, Professional Courses or any other 10+2 examination and

one of the subject English is compulsory recognized as equivalent thereto in such subjects and with such standards of attainments as may be prescribed.

- B) In the case of the B.A. Semester II, III, IV, V and VI, the student should have attended a minimum of 90 days in the respective semester and passed the previous semester examination as per the ordinance no. 10 of ATKT rules.
- 7. The ATKT rules to admission for B.A. Course Semester, (Theory and Practical as separate passing head and on calculation fraction, if any, shall be ignored) shall be as given in following table:

- 17. The scope of the subjects shall be as indicated in the syllabi.
- 18. The maximum marks allotted to each subject, Paper, Internal Assessment and the minimum marks which an examinee must obtain in order to pass (वाड्मय स्नातक (ग्रामीण सेवा भाग-1) B. A. (Rural Services) Part-I Examination, (वाड्मय स्नातक (ग्रामीण सेवा भाग-2) B. A. (Rural Services) Part-II Examination and (वाड्मय स्नातक (ग्रामीण सेवा अन्त्य) B. A. (Rural Services)
  - Final Examination, as the case may be, shall be as indicated in the Appendices A, B and C respectively.
- 19. There shall be no classification of examinees successful at the (वाड्मय स्नातक (ग्रामीण सेवा भाग-1) B. A. (Rural Services) Part-I Examination, (वाड्मय स्नातक (ग्रामीण सेवा भाग-2) B. A. (Rural Services) Part-II Examination.
- 20. Examinees successful at the वाड्मय स्नातक (ग्रामीण सेवा अन्त्य) B. A. (Rural Services) Final Examination, obtaining 60% or more of the aggregate marks shall be placed in the First Division, those obtaining less than 60% but not less than 45% of such marks shall be placed in te Second Division and all other successful examinees in the Third division at the वाड्मय स्नातक (ग्रामीण सेवा अन्त्य) B. A. (Rural Services) Final Examination shall be

based on the aggregate of the marks obtained by an examinee at the (वाड्मय स्नातक(ग्रामीण सेवा भाग-1, 2 व अन्त्य) B. A. (Rural Services) Part-I, II and Final Examinations taken together.

Provided that the Division of a candidate who has passed the वाड्मय स्नातक (ग्रामीण सेवा अन्त्य) B. A. (Rural Services) Final Examination after passing the Intermediate Examination or (वाड्मय स्नातक भाग-1, 2 B. A. (Arts) Part-I, II or B. Com. Parts-I, II or B. Sc. Parts-I, II Examination of the University or of any other Statutory University of First Year Examination of the Three Year Diploma Course in Rural Services of the Rural institution shall be declared on the basis of the aggregate of the marks obtained by him in the Examinations referred to the above calculated in proportion to the total marks

assigned to the (वाड्मय स्नातक (ग्रामीण सेवा भाग-1 व 2 B. A. (Rural Services) Part-I, IIExaminations and the marks obtained by him at the (वाड्मय स्नातक (ग्रामीण सेवा अन्त्य) B. A. (Rural Services) Final Examination taken together.

21. (i) Examinees who are successful at each of the वाड्मय स्नातक (ग्रामीण सेवा) B. A.

- (Rural Services) Examinations appearing in all the subjects at one and the same time and obtaining not less than 75% of the marks prescribed in a subject shall be awarded to have passed the examination with Distinction in the subject.
- (ii) No distinction shall be awarded at the ; वाड्मय स्नातक (ग्रामीण सेवा) भाग 1 व 2)B. A. (Rural Services) Parts-I, II Examinations. Distinction at \*Examination shall be awarded on the basis of the marks obtained at the (वाड्मय स्नातक (ग्रामीण सेवा भाग–1, 2 व अन्त्य) B. A. (Rural Services) Part-I, II and Final Examinations taken together.
- 22. Provision of Ordinance No. 7-A relating to the Condonation of Deficiency of Marks for Passing an Examination and of Ordinance No. 10 relating to Exemptions and Compartments as amended p-to-date shall apply to the Examinations under this Ordinance.
- 23. A person who has passed the ;वाड्मय स्नातक (ग्रामीण सेवा अन्त्य) B. A. (Rural Services) Final Examination under this Ordinance may, on payment of fresh fee be admitted to a subsequent examination in one or more subjects not offered by him earlier. An Examinee who secure not less than the minimum pass marks prescribed in the subject or subjects shall be issued a Certificate of having passed in the additional subject as the case may be.
- 24. (i) As soon as possible after the Examination, but not later than 30<sup>th</sup> June next following, in case of examination held in March/April and 28<sup>th</sup> February next following in case of examination held in October/November, the Executive Council shall publish a list of successful examinees at the B. A. (Rural Services) Part-I Examination (वाड्मय स्नातक (ग्रामीण सेवा भाग–1) B. A. (Rural Services) Part-II Examination, (वाड्मय स्नातक (ग्रामीण सेवा भाग–2) B. A. (Rural Services) Final Examination (वाड्मय स्नातक (ग्रामीण सेवा अन्त्य).

\*Effective from the Part-I Examination of 1979, Part-II Examination 1980 and Final Examination of 1981.

- (ii) The name of examinees having the (वाड्मय स्नातक (ग्रामीण सेवा अन्त्य) B. A. (Rural Services) Final Examination as a whole in the minimum prescribed period and obtaining the prescribed number of places in the First or Second Division shall be arranged in Order of Merit, as provided in the Examinations in General Ordinance No. 6.
- 25. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Ordinance no person shall be admitted to an examination under this Ordinance, if he has already passed this examination or an equivalent examination of any other Stationary University.
- 26. Examinees successful at the B. A. (Rural Services) Part-I Examination ;वाड्मय स्नातक (ग्रामीण सेवा भाग-1) B. A. (Rural Services) Part-II Examination, (वाड्मय स्नातक (ग्रामीण सेवा भाग-2) shall be entitled to receive a Certificate in the prescribed form, signed by the Registrar. Examinees successful at the (वाड्मय स्नातक (ग्रामीण सेवा अन्त्य) B. A. (Rural Services) Final Examination shall on payment of the prescribed fees receive a Degree in the prescribed form signed by the Vice-Chancellor.
- 27. The scheme of awarding marks shall as per Appendix appended with this Direction.
- 28. Absorption Scheme for Course of B.A. (R.S.) Students
  - a. While switching over to Semester, the failure students of annual pattern will be given five chances to clear the examination. After availing five chances for clearing the examination as per annual pattern, no examination would be held for annual pattern candidates. The students who fail to clear the examination within the available chances would have to take fresh admission in the semester pattern course.

- b. The candidate who have cleared first year annual pattern examination in the subject or are allowed to keep term (ATKT) as per annual pattern shall get admission to semester III directly.
- c. The candidate who have cleared second year annual pattern examination in the subject or are allowed to keep term (ATKT) as per annual pattern shall get admission to semester V directly.
- d. The candidate of old course (Yearly Pattern) shall be permitted to appear for higher class (Semester III or V) as per the new course (Semester Pattern) examination of the Bachelor of Arts (Rural Services) programme (Semester Pattern) provided they submitted Eligibility Certificate (as per proforma given bellow) from the Principal of the College stating that he/ she has satisfactory undergone a course of study.
